Hundred House Inn

rom about the 7th century a hundred was the division of a shire for military iudicial administrative. & purposes. Within each hundred there was a meeting place where the men of the hundred discussed local issues. & judicial trials were enacted. The trials ceased at the start of the First World War but the Hundred House Inn, which was originally the meeting place for the Purslow Hundred, is still a popular venue for local men (& now women!) to gather & put the world to rights.

For over thirty five years from about 1870 onwards the inn was run by Edward Smith, & when the licence was renewed in 1901, the records report it had been in continuous use as an inn for at least 165 years. In 1905 the Earl of Powys leased the Hundred House to the People's Refreshment House Association finally selling it to them in 1926.

Fourteen years ago Sue Berry, originally an illustrator, came from Staffordshire to take over the pub & now she runs it with the help of bar manager



Sam Cottrell (pictured left with Sue) & chef Rhys Jones. Over the years she has made some changes including making the original car park at the front into a popular beer garden. The function room upstairs, which many locals remember fondly as a venue for dances is now a flat, but weddings, christenings & parties are still catered for, often using a

marquee in the garden. Food is served every evening from Tuesday to Sunday, plus lunches on Saturday & Sunday, & a takeaway (or eat in) pizza service is also now being offered.

As well as running a busy pub Sue has also trained as a counsellor. At present she works as a volunteer counsellor in Shrewsbury Prison & also for the Powys Drugs & Alcohol Centre in Welshpool. At some time in the future she hopes to be able to offer her services based at the Hundred House. This will be a modern take on landladies needing to be good listeners!

And for those with apples still left! Scrumptious Apple Pudding

3 cooking apples, peeled, cored & halved (pears or plums can also be used)
75g (3oz) butter
125g (4oz) sugar
2tbs plain flour, sifted
4tbs top of the milk or cream

50g (2oz) flaked almonds
Extra cream to serve

Serves 6

Preheat the oven to 200C/Gas mark 6 Place the apples, (or other fruit), rounded side up in a buttered ovenproof dish. Place the butter, sugar, flour & milk or cream in a pan & heat gently until blended. Add the flaked almonds & stir well. Pour over the apples & bake in the oven for 20-25 minutes, until the apples are tender. Serve immediately with cream.

From the Archives

The condition of the South Shropshire labourer was highlighted in 1872 at a meeting of the new North Herefordshire South Shropshire Agricultural Labourers' Mutual Improvement Society, attended by c. 300. The standard wage seems to have been 9s. [45p] a week (18d. [7½p] a day) with an extra shilling if Sunday work was required. Even with the usual perks, then worth perhaps 3s. or 4s. a week, it was not enough according to those at the meeting. A labourer from Twitchen, in Clunbury, who had 10s. a week, a free house & garden (the keep of 2 pigs), & perks, admitted that he had more than many but also complained that it was not enough to keep a family. There were new expenses too: it was hard to afford schooling out of 10s. a week. Even the most industrious labourer, it was claimed, could not in the long run avoid the workhouse. Such had been the fears of a generation or more of labouring men, since the formation of the poor-law unions in 1836-7.

Local History Centre Launched

Bishop's Castle Heritage Resource Centre, based in Chapel Yard, will be open as a Local History Centre from 2 October. Volunteers will be available to help with local & family history questions every Saturday morning from 10.30am – 1pm.

A grant from the Heritage Lottery Fund has helped finance a project in which have volunteers taken digital photographs of parish registers & other material at Shropshire Archives. The CD for Clunbury parish (which includes Baptisms & burials 1795-1841; Baptisms 1842-1993; Burials 1813-1929; General registers 1574-1794; Marriages 1754-1968: Church accounts 1628-1776 & Tithe maps for Clunbury; Kempton; Clunton, plus apportionment; Clunbury & Coston, plus apportionment) can be viewed at the Centre. This is good news for local historians as it could mean fewer journeys to Shrewsbury.


The Centre also has a reference library of books ranging from general local history to specific Shropshire titles & an extensive collection of local maps.
