


Farewell from Barney and Amaryllis

Black News of a White Owl

Bird lovers will be shocked to hear the results of the post mortem carried out on a Barn Owl which was found dead, in March, on Clunton Hill, north of Clunton. The bird



had been shot in the chest and, judging by the number of pellet wounds, at close range. Barn Owls are a protected species and the police have been informed, as well as the RSPB.

Barn Owls feed on small rodents and are no threat to anyone's livelihood. So why kill them? There are so few left in the area! Let's hope that whoever pulled the trigger realises the seriousness of his/her action.

Notes on Clunbury Parish Council Meeting

Held on 28 July in Clunton VH **Present**: 8 councillors, the Clerk and one member of the public

Apologies: Sandra Morgan

Minutes from the Annual Parish Council Meeting were agreed. Matters arising regarding Byway Open to All Traffic at Cwm Lane Cottage, Ashbeds and Clunbury Mains Drainage are still not resolved. Schools reorganisation was discussed: negotiations regarding а possible collaboration between Clunbury. Clun. Bucknell and Newcastle schools are on-going. In the absence of a response from the Parish Council. Shropshire Council have followed the wish of the parishioners as expressed in regarding the Parish Plan housina development.

Local Joint Committee: vice chairman John Croxton reported that some grants had been accorded to a number a projects – Clunton Village Hall for example. However, there is still £19,000 left to distribute before next February (the money will not be carried over to another year). Applications for projects benefiting the community should be sent to John Croxton as soon as possible.

Parish Plan: John Hoskins had drawn up a list of outstanding action points, the unresolved ones being as follows:

Notice Board at Purslow: investigations regarding a small off-the-shelf or bespoke board.

Litter picking: some interest has been shown, but **a volunteer is needed** to organise and lead the work. Anybody willing? Please contact John Hoskins on 660192 or The Parish Post.

Speeding traffic: the problems of exits from Kempton were discussed in view of a recent accident. Could something else be done to calm down the traffic, particularly at milking time? A review of the Parish Plan should take place in 2011.

The Under 5s group will continue to run with Zoe and a new assistant (the post has been advertised), when Amaryllis leaves.

Correspondence: Shropshire Council is running a Community Tree Scheme by which free trees can be claimed between now and 2 December for any planting project with public amenity value.

Advanced External Defibrillator: in rural areas such as ours, knowing how to use a defibrillator (to restart the heart) can make the difference between life and death. Training is available for anyone interested. The next session will take place at the Kangaroo on 14 August. Contact E Jones for more details: (jonesmardu@btinternet.com)
