Parish Council Meeting 19 July

Report

The meeting opened with resignation of Cllr Hoskins. He felt he could not continue as it was his view that Shropshire Council (SC) ignored the views of Parish Councils whilst at the same time expecting them to take on more responsibilities. He left the meeting. Members of the Council concurred with his view and agreed that they would take the matter up with Nigel Hartin and, hopefully, through him with SC. meeting will be held to discuss a response.

Six councillors present + three members of the public. Apologies from Cllr Lewis.

Matters Arising from the Minutes of meeting held on 17 May 2018

Oddfellows Banner: no new home has been found vet but it cannot be housed in the Church. It was agreed that the Clerk make bluow contact with those concerned and try to relocate it. Colin Payne to be kept informed. Photographs could be taken and kept in the Parish. Suggestions for relocation included: Bishop's Castle Heritage Resource Centre and the Records Office in Shrewsbury. Care would be needed with regard to temperature, etc, as it is very fragile. The matter will be kept on the agenda.

Footbridge at Clunbury: Cllr Hill had spoken to Catherine Lishman, our Footpath Warden, and had been advised that work has been scheduled for the week beginning 23 July.

Broadband Connection Kempton: no news available but work to install ducting for Fibre Network will take place in Clunbury from 6 to 24 August.

Planning: no new applications.

Decisions: Hawthorn Cottage, Beambridge (removal of existing building yard and erection of dwelling) – granted. Clunton Farmhouse (re. drainage) – granted.

Kempton Farm (conversion of farm buildings to form 6 dwellings) – granted.

Clunton Coppice (erection of affordable dwelling) awaiting decision – subject to 106 agreement.

Hurst Barn (erection of 2 poultry sheds) – referred to SC officer – nothing heard awaiting decision.

Fitzwaryn Hall, Clunton (erection of garage/office) - granted and under construction now. Listed status application has been withdrawn.

West Shropshire LJC: 3 grants approved: £70 for 'Life on the Edge' in Bishop's Castle – a project to encourage wildlife on grass verges; £100 for BC Medical Practice to enable them to organise an Osteoporosis Awareness Session in Norbury Village Hall; £140 for 'Fight on Plastics' in Bishop's Castle. Small grants of up to £150 are still available so please send in applications. The next meeting is scheduled for November/December

NHS: the LJC had been due to meet with Simon Freeman. Chief Shropshire Clinical Commissioning Group but he didn't Questionnaires are in the Parish (but have to be looked for!) they should be returned by 4 September. Sylvia Jones updated the meeting on the two options offered for future care at the two hospitals. It seems that both options would lead to a reduction in the number of beds available. She repeated that the £312m from Central Government is only a loan which would have to be repaid with interest. At present many patients from Wales are receiving treatment in Shropshire hospitals (who receive funding for this care). Should Mid Wales succeed in their efforts to keep their patients in Wales (as they are trying to do), Shropshire hospitals would suffer a loss of revenue. Shropshire already receives lower than average funding per patient (the government finding it not rural enough) and it is felt that too much money is spent on 'the management' of a fractured system (7 different hospitals). The care of elderly patients in outlying areas is still to be considered. It was

agreed to arrange a local meeting and to invite members of other parishes. This to be held at Clunbury Village Hall during the week commencing 13 August. [See poster on page 7]

Roads:

Lamps: all seem to be working although some are still on at 2am.

Potholes: it seems to be very difficult to get all potholes mended. Work is only done on those with white lines painted round them!

Verges: seem not be up to standard this year particularly at Purslow Crossroads. One reason for this is that cutting was started later due to a change in contractor. Reflective posts are to be erected on a damaged roadside bank in Twitchen in an attempt to discourage lorries from driving over it.

Kempton B4385: nothing to report.

Correspondence: none. Emails had been circulated including one from SC regarding Burial Spaces. Cllr Harding to look at Clunbury and Clunton and liaise with the Clerk.

The Clerk's new computer has been purchased.

Any Other Business: footpaths: Catherine Lishman, Footpath Warden, had reported that 2 stiles have been replaced and 2 kissing gates installed recently.

Reminder To Riparian Landowners

You are responsible for maintaining the watercourse that borders or runs through your property.

If the watercourse flows along your property's boundary, then your responsibility is deemed to be up to its centre line. You must ensure that water can flow freely and there are no restrictions that may increase the risk of flooding.

Your responsibilities include:

- · clearing any debris
- managing vegetation within the channel and clearing any cuttings
- ensuring the flow of water isn't obstructed
- maintaining the bank and bed of your section of the watercourse.

You are also entitled to:

- protect your property from flooding
- protect your land from erosion.

During the summer and very dry spells, the water levels are very low. Please ensure there are no obstructions to the flow. If possible an area of the verges should be left uncut to provide some shelter for wildlife and prevent water evaporation.

Before any cutting on verges or banks, please check for nest sites, which must not be disturbed.
