Broadband Misery

re you on the telephone line that snakes its way from Little Brampton. through Clunbury and out to the Twitchen? And how reliable is vour broadband? It does not matter whether you get broadband from BT or any other supplier - it all totters along the same aged cabling. Right at the end of a spur up Redwood Lane the residents are in dispute with BT, they had broadband guite happily for two years, then on February 22nd this year, with no warning, their broadband disappeared. never to reconnect again! Their complaints have gone right to the top of BT, and an assistant to the Chief Executive has told them thev are too far from the exchange... of course their house has not moved. If there are any other sufferers of poor, non-existent, or interrupted service on this line perhaps we could get together and lobby for new cabling to be installed. This particular complaint is now going to the Ombudsman Service - and any evidence of other failures on this particular line would be helpful to all of us. not just the residents of Redwood Lane. Shropshire County Council are aware of the problems rural areas experience and a campaign has been launched to encourage residents and businesses to pledge their support for bringing better broadband to Shropshire The Government has ploughed £8.2 million into the Connecting Shropshire project, with the same being invested bv Shropshire Council, and it has now reached the crucial stage where your help i s needed. Register аt www.connectingshropshire.co.uk to show your support - you are not signing up to anything, just showing you would consider having superfast broadband if it became available. Anyone who does not have internet access can fill in the survey at their local library or Broadplace. Alternatively you can call Shropshire Council's customer service team on 0345 678 9000 and an adviser will be able to take your details.
