Leo Smith a Trustee of the Welsh Kite Trust has commented as follows: 'I have studied Kites and been involved in their conservation in Wales and the Shropshire Hills since 2003 but I have never heard of an incident of this nature. The Kites around here are all descended from wild Welsh birds, which suffered relentless persecution until relatively recently, and in general they remain very wary. Perhaps this was an injured bird that had been re-habilitated and had lost its fear of humans. If the Kite comes close again Joseph, see if you can get a photo on your ipod. I would love to see it.'

Sadly a Red Kite was found dead on the B4385 near Old Kempton Stores in January, close to another road casualty.

> a Pheasant: we assume that the Kite was attempting to scavenge the latter's remains It was ringed. enabling Tony Cross of the Welsh Kite Trust to inform us that it was reared at Devil's Bridge, Ceredigion in 2004 and was thought to be a male. It may have bred near Llangollen 2006. but in 2008. and 2010 it was one of a breeding site in the area where 1. 1. and 2

Kites bred near Ludlow in 1876, but this was the last known breeding attempt in Shropshire, indeed in England, until recent years, and it was not until 2006, 130 years later, that Kites bred successfully again in the county. In 2012, 23 nests were found in

Church Electoral Roll

Letter from Revd Paul Wignall

The Church of England, through its parish system, seeks to care for the needs of every man, woman and child in our nation. As residents of the parish, we hope that you can feel that St Swithin's has a special place in your lives, whether you attend the church or not.

Some people choose to show their sense of belonging to the parish by placing their names on the church electoral roll, which allows you to attend and vote at our Annual Meeting and to raise any points of concern or interest about the parish or its church at that meeting. Being on the electoral roll also makes you eligible for election to the Parochial Church Council (PCC), the body responsible for working with me on matters of general concern to the parish and its church.

Anyone who is baptized and lives in the parish may join the electoral roll. You may also be on the Clunbury roll if you live in another parish but regularly worship here.

Every six years we have to make a completely new church electoral roll. Everyone who wants to be on the new roll has to complete a form, even if you were on the previous one. You will find the form in the church, complete with instructions about how to fill it in and to whom it needs to be returned. We hope you will either make or continue your connection with your local church by having your name included on its electoral roll. To do this, please complete the form and return it by 25 March 2013.
