The 2011 Lapwings urvey showed yet another decline in the Lapwing population. Only 5 young



are known to have fledged over the last 3 years. This level of productivity is not sufficient to sustain the local population. Some steps have been taken to try and improve their breeding habitat, but will they make a difference? Other species also appear to be in decline. Your help is needed to ensure that all sightings are recorded.

Wildlife Gardening

lmost 60 people were present at the SWSGC in January to hear John Fannin give the first talk of the new year. He spoke on "Gardening for wildlife" and our need to provide help for birds, insects and small mammals, in the face of urban spread. He pointed out that helping to increase wildlife is in our own interests, as the "goodies eat the baddies". illustrated his talk with homemade examples of bird, bat, dormouse, hedgehog and insect boxes. He advised against using pesticides, but if we must, to use them last thing at night when bees will have returned to their hives. He suggested that we should not be too tidy in the garden, leave some nettles and a small woodpile where mammals and insects can hide. A pond, a wildflower meadow and native plants such as honeysuckle, crab apple and ivy will also encourage wildlife. John gave us a thoroughly stimulating evening, packed with detail and interesting tips.

The next meeting of the club is on 28 March, in Lydbury North Village Hall at 7.30 pm. The speaker will be Stan Wild on the subject of "Growing Japanese Maples from Seed". For further details contact Pauline 660120. Visitors always welcome.

Parish Council Meeting 26 Jan

AED: A presentation was given by Cliff Medlicott of WM Ambulance Service about the Clun Valley AED scheme. As previously, reported this complements the Ambulance and First Responder services and is co-ordinated locally by Eddie Jones. The nearest defibrillators to our area are in Clun and Aston, but more will be allocated as funds become available and volunteers are trained. Cliff emphasised the user friendliness of the equipment, with audible prompts to remind the operator of each step.

8 people in the parish have received training so far, including 6 in Clunton. The next (free) local training course is on April 14, anyone interested should contact Eddie on 640856.

There was general agreement that the Council should support the scheme, and later in the meeting a contribution of £350 was approved, to come from reserves.

Vacancy: A by-election may be needed if there is more than one volunteer in response to the current adverts for the Parish Councillor vacancy. If there are no volunteers, then co-option may be necessary.

BOAT: Shropshire Council (SC) have advised that the Byway Open to All Traffic (BOAT), a green lane that runs from Clunton to Clun below Sowdley Woods, is unlikely to have its status changed, even though Clunbury PC believe it to be unsuitable for motor traffic. Clun PC have indicated there are no problems their end, where it is much wider. It was agreed to ask the farmer who originally raised the issue to keep a of incidents before proceeding further. (If anyone else encounters dangerous incidents on this or any other green lane in the parish please let the PC or Parish Post have details).

Footbridges: The footbridge over the Clun in Clunbury has been inspected by SC and is due for maintenance work next year. Another nearby footbridge is said to be in good order, but the PC are to challenge this.

Speeds Near Kempton: A survey of traffic on the B4385 through Kempton indicates average speeds of about 44 mph, with a small percentage exceeding 55 mph. A mandatory 40 limit was not thought to offer much potential reduction.

Rates: The Parish precept for next year was proposed to be unchanged, with reserves being used to cover a small predicted shortfall.

Cardboard Waste: A request has been made by a parishioner for the PC to fund a skip for collecting waste cardboard. In view of the need to support 3 centres, it was decided to find out what SC's medium term plans are before reviewing further.

Footpaths: A new footpath monitor is needed for the Parish. It was decided to discuss this with members of the local walking group before seeking a volunteer.

↑ I ell, we haven't got one yet, but meanwhile there have been some changes.

Since the end of January our old group of parishes has been split: Clungunford, Hopton and Bedstone are now part of the Bucknell group, while Clunbury, Clunton and Hopesay have joined the new 'Clun Valley Benefice' and we are linked with Bettws y crwyn, Newcastle and Clun.

The date has now passed for intending applicants to our benefice to apply and there were none to go forward to a shortlist, but we are still hopeful that we may get a suitable applicant in due course, though there are seven other vacancies in the Hereford diocese at the moment, so it may be a while!

Churchwardens and others in our new group have been meeting to get to know each other and to co-ordinate services: and it has been quite exciting to have so many different clergy taking our services, particularly when they come from a bit of a distance and go to Clungunford or Clunton, instead of Clunbury.

We have had a lot of things to learn that Barney normally did for us, but we seem to have managed reasonably well. This has been in great part due to the Rev Ogram (part-time Ann stipendiary minister in Clun), whose work load has more than quadrupled in the months! She has appointed Curate in Charge of the Clun Valley Benefice until a new vicar is appointed.

Last of all, come and walk up Clunbury Hill on Good Friday, April 6, (3pm at the crossroads) and have tea in the village hall afterwards. Christina Whitehead
