



South West Shropshire Gardening Club

↑ t the March meeting Stan Wild spoke about growing maples from seed. Maples occur naturally across the northern hemisphere: field maple (often used as a hedging plant) and sycamore. Maples are renowned for their autumn colour which is enhanced by sunny days and low temperatures. Some maples are grown for their attractive bark and some for their food value (one pint of maple syrup requires five gallons of sap). They are easy to grow and there is one to suit every garden. They may vary in size from two feet to fifty two feet, as in Hergest Croft Garden. Each member of the audience came away with two germinated seeds and very clear written instructions. Hopefully the population of South West Shropshire will rise dramatically over the next few years.

Clunbury Parish Past & Present Extracts from the record of the Visitation by Archdeacon Plymley (later named

Corbett), 1793

urther to my introductory note in the April issue of *The Parish Post*, herewith the first extract from Archdeacon Plymley's report on his visitation to Clunbury on 13 April 1793. Anyone interested in reading the full report should go to Shropshire Archives where it is referenced SA6001/6860-5.

Population is the principal topic of this extract. The wording follows that of the original document, with the exception of editorial insertions which are in square brackets. The text was written following the visitation of 1793 but, where indicated, the Archdeacon added further information at a later date.

Clunbury township 167 inhabitants Kempton township 188 persons Clunton township 266 persons Obley township 123 [Total 744] The total No. of houses in the Parish is 113 so that there are above 6½ persons to each house.

There is a constable for each township. There is only one public house, viz Purslow Hundred House.

1800: in all 794 persons

1831: Clunbury and Obley townships 430. Clunton and Kempton 529 = 959 [in total]

[For comparison, the population in 2001 was 478, when there was an average of 2.1 persons per household]. *Tom Wall*

hropshire Council has a Customer Service Face to Face Point in Enterprise House, Bishop's Castle, open Monday and Friday 9am to 2.30pm. On Tuesdays the advisor is available for any local gatherings or clubs in the area. This is your local access to your council services. Here are some of the services you can get help and advice on: waste collections, concessionary travel (you will need to bring proof of address and date of birth for a new bus pass or rail voucher), Link bus service, blue badge applications, street cleansing, lighting and highways, help applying for, and filling in, benefit forms, school transport. Use it as your first point of contact for vour council.
