## Minor Injuries Unit – Did You Know?

We drove all the way to Shrewsbury Royal Hospital A & E Department with a minor head injury, only to choose between a three hour wait for an appointment or travel back to Ludlow Community Hospital and be treated immediately at 4.30pm on a Saturday afternoon.

What a difference - but why did we not know about this service? It has now been publicised in the local press but in case you missed it here is the information you need which could save you a round trip of 50 miles.

The Minor Injuries Unit at Ludiow is open from 8am to 8pm seven days a week (the main door is shut at 5pm but there is a bell to ring for assistance). The X-Ray Department runs from 9am to 3pm. The Unit can deal with cuts and scrapes requiring glue or sutures; suspected fractures; soft tissue injuries; minor burns and scalds; animal and insect bites; and foreign bodies in the eyes, ears or nose.

So – when your GP practice is busy or closed – go to Ludlow Community Hospital and save hours of queuing, expensive parking and receive prompt, personal and friendly professional treatment. Barbara Freeman
