Waste Recycling Permits

f you take waste to any of Shropshire Council's Household Recycling Centres (HRC's) in a trailer or commercial-type vehicle, you may need an entry permit. Certain types of vehicles are completely banned. To avoid disappointment, call 0345 6789 007 before you visit the site or you may be prevented from using it.

Entry permits are free to households in the Shropshire Council area. You must apply in advance and then 12 permits will be posted out. You are limited to 12 permits once every 12 months. Each permit allows one visit to an HRC. Permits get checked by the site attendant. A permit does not entitle you to tip or recycle trade waste.

You do not need a permit if you are using a standard car or a small trailer which is no more than 1 m² (4 ft x 3 ft). For more information go to www.shropshire.gov.uk/waste.nsf
