Parish Council Notes

Clumbury Parish Council met on 29 September in Clumbury Village Hall. Present: Cllrs. Bailey, Davies, Marsh, Morgan and Seabury, Clerk, 2 members of the public. Apologies: Cllrs. Collins, Hoskins. Two Cllrs. unaccounted for. Cllr Penny Marsh chaired the meeting.

A minutes silence was held in memory of ex Parish Councillor Ken Jones who died recently.

Matter Arising: A site visit with SC to the byway at Cwm Lane Cottage is being arranged. SC is to publish an order realigning the bridleway near Ashbeds in Clunton Coppice, Cllrs, Consider that the proposed new route for the bridleway is too steep to be ridden safely but there seems to be no further action they can take. Clerk has written three times to BT about the vandalised telephone box in Kempton but has received no reply. Clerk to write again. Janie Mitchall from Kempton has agreed to organise litter picking. SC has offered a site meeting to review speeding traffic problems in Kempton, Our Parish Tree Warden Lizzie Potter has produced a report identifying 80 ageing trees. Some landowners would not permit access so the actual number probably greater (do they have something to hide or are they just bloody minded?). The next training session for the AED Scheme will be in Clunton Village Hall on 12 November.

A complaint had been received because access to the telephone box at Twitchen is obstructed by waste material, bins and parked cars. Cllrs. Bailey and Morgan to seek to resolve the issue with the residents concerned.

Cllr. Morgan reported that locks on the forest road access gates on Black Hill had been changed and that the keys held by the Parish Council no longer worked. Cllr. Morgan offered to lead an expedition to the Parish Land once the access issue had been resolved. (Apparently the Parish Council, and hence the Parish,

owns land on Black Hill, however, there seems to be a lack of readily available documentation to back this up. In the past the Parish owned more land, but due to poor decisions and a lack of formal procedures by various organisations, assets were squandered and rent foregone. Evidence for what remains seems to rely on the folk memory of the older generation rather than deeds. The current councillors need to put this matter on a formal and legal footing before it is too late).


Cllr. Seabury reported that the footbridge over the stream behind Chapel House in Clunbury requires painting (and he should know!). Clerk to write to SC.
