Clunbury Parish Past & Present

arrher to my introductory note in the April issue of the Parish Post, herewith the fourth and final extract from Archdeacon Plymley's report on his visitation to Clunbury in 1793; it relates to employment and education.

The labourers have 1s.6d a day and most of them keep a pig and the farmers will let them have as much ground rent free to rear potatoes as they can find manure for. They do not brew any malt liquor. The poor children are put out apprentices at 8,9 or 10 years of age and bound for 7 years. There is a workhouse. Four old women teach school in different parts of this Parish. A piece of land value 5£, has its income divided among them.

In his A Country Education: A History of the Schools of Clunbury, Chris Train reviews the limited evidence and concludes that it was in the 1820s that the first school was built in the parish 'on the small field across the ford and opposite what is now Chapel House, on an area by the river called Village Green'. The present school was built in 1862.

It seems that in1793 the only education was through what are referred to as 'dame schools' at which women provided elementary education, in some cases little more than day-care, in their own homes. Chris Train records a charitable gift made in 1699 of land in Obley, known as School Piece, for the benefit of the poor of the parish and a second such gift made in 1760. It is perhaps to the income from such land that Archdeacon Plymley refers.

Anyone interested in reading Archdeacon Plymley's full report should go to Shropshire Archives. The Clunbury report is referenced SA6001/6860-5 but reports are available on many local parishes.

Fire birds alight in Kempton

ocal birdwatchers have been excited to find a pair of Firecrests breeding

this year in Kempton – the first such record for Shropshire. No bigger than a Wren, the Firecrest is more strongly marked than

its better-known relative, the Goldcrest, having a black stripe through the eye, over which there is a broad white band. Males have a fiery-red crest.

The first confirmed breeding record for the UK was 50 years ago, in Hampshire, and today there are probably 1,000 or more breeding pairs in the country, the majority in southern England. Climate change may be a factor in the northward expansion.

We cover the Clun Valley from Aston to Newcastle and cater for those not only registered with the Meadows Surgery but also with other GPs covering the area. We need more volunteers, especially in the areas around Clunbury, as it would be good to put people in touch with someone local to them with local contacts and knowledge rather than someone from Clun.

We have regular meetings with staff from the Severn Hospice and have training sessions planned for 15 & 16 October.
