The First Since 1862

On 16 July, readers of *The Independent* were treated to this historic photo which may well have been taken in our parish. It is of a pine marten, a cat-sized carnivore related to the stoat and polecat. Once widespread in England they were persecuted to extinction in the 19th century and the last Shropshire record was of one killed in Bucknell Wood in 1862.

Pine martens survive in reasonable numbers in the west of Ireland and north of Scotland and a sparse population persists in the wilder parts of Wales. It is possible that the animal in the photo had wandered from there, whereas recent sightings in Cornwall and Staffordshire are thought more likely to be of escaped or released individuals. So the sighting of the pine marten in this photo (right), taken by



Dave Pearce (a well-respected bird-watcher from Craven Arms) has been dubbed the first confirmed observation of a wild pine marten in England for a hundred years. For understandable reasons the precise location of the observation is being kept secret, but the photo was taken in the Clun valley, quite possibly not far from where you are



reading this. Camera traps have since recorded footage of two pine martens in the area. Should you happen to see a pine marten yourself, or, better still, get a photo, do please let us know.

The Shropshire Wildlife Trust is setting up a pine marten project to find out more about the numbers and distribution of pine martens in Shropshire. If you have any information, please contact Stuart Edmunds on 01743 284280
