Locals Shop for Success!

The rain held off long enough for Aston on Clun Community Shop volunteers, past and present, to toast 10 years of successful trading on 13 April 2023. Pauline Johnson, current Chair of the Shop stated: 'When a group of enterprising villagers took on the ambitious project of starting a community shop, they could not envisage that ten years later, the Shop would have taken over £1 million and would be a vital part of the local economy. The Shop has become much more than a place to buy necessities - it is a vital hub for socialising and communication.'

Open every day, except Christmas Day, the Shop is exceptional in that it is managed and run by volunteers only; of 400 community shops around the country, only 20 operate with no paid staff.

Volunteers said they love 'giving back', 'it is lots of fun and you meet lovely people'; customers comment, 'there is always a friendly face', 'prices are very reasonable in these difficult times'.

Shropshire Council recently renewed the trading licence, so the volunteers not only toasted their accomplishment so far, but raised a glass to the future and the continued success of this rather special local enterprise with the community at its heart.

Climate and Ecology Bill

This Bill now has the backing not only of Shropshire Council but also those of Shrewsbury, Oswestry, Whitchurch, Ludlow, Bishop's Castle and others, including a number of Parish Councils. We are very hopeful that our Council will add its support when it meets next, on 18 May. The Bill, which is currently before Parliament, seeks amongst other things, to

- Require that the UK commits to doing its full and fair share to limit the global temperature rise to 1.5 degrees, enshrining this objective into law
- Ensure that biodiversity loss is halted and reversed by 2030
- Oblige the UK to take responsibility for its greenhouse gas footprint, by accounting for emissions related to imported goods and services
- Set up a temporary Climate and Nature Assembly

CORONATION QUICHE

1 x 20cm flan tin, serves 6

A deep quiche with a crisp, light pastry case and delicate flavours of spinach, broad beans and fresh tarragon. Eat hot or cold with a



green salad and boiled new potatoes. Perfect for a Coronation Big Lunch.

Filling

125 ml milk

175 ml double cream

2 medium eggs

1 tablespoon chopped fresh tarragon salt and pepper

100 g grated cheddar cheese

180 g cooked spinach, lightly chopped

60 g cooked broad beans or soya beans

Pastry

125 g plain flourpinch of salt25 g cold butter, diced

25 g lard

2 tablespoons milk

or 1 x 250 g block of ready-made shortcrust pastry

1. To make pastry:

- a) sieve flour and salt into a bowl: add fats and rub the mixture together using your fingertips until you get a sandy, breadcrumb like texture.
- b) add the milk a little at a time and bring together into a dough
- c) cover and allow to rest in the fridge for 30 to 45 mins
- 2. Lightly flour the work surface and roll out the pastry to a circle a little larger than the top of the tin and approx. 5 mm thick.
- 3. Line the tin with the pastry, taking care not to have any holes or the mixture could leak. Cover and rest for a further 30 mins in the fridge.
- 4. Preheat the oven to 190° C
- 5. Line the pastry case with greaseproof paper, add baking beans and bake blind for 15 minutes before removing the greaseproof -paper and baking beans.
- 6. Reduce the oven temperature to 160° C
- 7. Beat together the milk, cream, eggs, herbs and seasoning.
- 8. Scatter 1/2 grated cheese in the pastry case, top with chopped spinach, beans and herbs, then pour over the liquid mixture.
- 9. If required gently give the mixture a delicate stir to ensure the filling is evenly distributed being careful not to damage the pastry case.
- 10. Sprinkle over the remaining cheese. Place into the oven and bake for 20 to 25 mins until set and lightly golden.

Noel was fun to be with, would always find time for a chat when out on his daily walks. He was a well-informed but modest man, knowledgeable in many fields. He will be remembered as the perfect foil to Anne's infectious enthusiasm and would chuckle quietly and gently move things on.

Humanity is the lesser without Noel and he is greatly missed.
