First Aid Course

Twelve participants from Clunbury and Kempton attended a full days First Aid training course on the 16th May which was delivered by Nick Badger from Shropshire First Aid Training (part of Safe Haven Training) at Clunbury Village Hall.

In the morning the course concentrated on CPR (cardio pulmonary resuscitation) and how to use an AED (automated external defibrillator). The AED machine in case of emergencies is located to the left of the front entrance to the Clunbury Village hall and on the front of the village hall in Kempton.

In the afternoon we covered many other topics including resuscitation, seizures, eye injuries, treatment of bleeding/wound packing, the list was very comprehensive. We are now prepared for many eventualities

All participants passed with flying colours and will be issued Certificates. It was a very informative and enjoyable day.

I would like to say a big thank you, on behalf of myself, and the participants from Clunbury and Kempton to Aston Village Shop and the Parish Council who together funded the course. We are extremely grateful for the course as it could help save lives and support the NHS which is crucial at this time when emergency services are under extreme pressure.

Parish Rambles

On Monday 8 May, Peter Carty of the National Trust led a walk round Walcot Wood at Kempton. The main focus was on the ancient oaks – 36 of them altogether, each of which has a specific management plan – but we looked to at wildflowers and listened to bird song. There were two tastings of Garlic Mustard or Jack-by-the-hedge; both received mixed reviews.

The old oaks have been growing here for hundreds of years, in what will have been a parkland setting, with little competition, but a relaxation of grazing in the middle of the last century led to colonisation by shrubs and trees. The old oaks need more light and space, so competing vegetation is being cleared progressively, with help from volunteers and a small flock of Hebridean Sheep.

Peter encouraged parishioners to visit the wood. It is open to all, but there is no on-site parking. It can be reached from Kempton or by walking down the right of way opposite the Bury Ditches car park.

On 28th June, Peter Carty has kindly agreed to lead a walk on Hopesay Hill for those intrepid enough to venture beyond our parish boundary. Parking is limited, so we are meeting at 6pm at Edgton Village Hall for car sharing as necessary. The walk will last about an an hour and a half.

Climate and Ecology Bill

A motion to support this Bill was carried unanimously at the Parish Council meeting on 18 May. This Bill has the backing not only of Shropshire Council but also those of the Town Councils of Shrewsbury, Oswestry, Whitchurch, Ludlow, Clun, Bishop's Castle as well as the support of a number of Parish Councils, now including Clunbury. The Bill, which is currently before Parliament, seeks amongst other things, to

- Require that the UK commits to doing its full and fair share to limit the global temperature rise to 1.5 degrees, enshrining this objective into law
- Ensure that biodiversity loss is halted and reversed by 2030
- Oblige the UK to take responsibility for its greenhouse gas footprint, by accounting for emissions related to imported goods and services
- Set up a temporary Climate and Nature Assembly

'On Whinberry Hill'

We are working on ideas for a sign which will explain the background to this project on the Black Hill and what it seeks to achieve. Currently our themes are the change from grouse moor to forestry plantation, the survival of the Parish land as a fragment of the former heathland, along with its wildlife, and the story of Whinberry picking. Quick and Easy Summer Salads

Crisp & Colourful Salad

Ingredients: Dressing: **3tbs Greek yoghurt** A head of Chicory A pointed red pepper Juice of half a lemon A bulb of fennel **3tbsp thick mayonnaise** An unpeeled apple 1tsp olive or walnut oil 1tbsp of capers, drained salt and pepper A handful of pine nuts or walnuts (optional) A handful of sultanas



Finely slice all the vegetables and mix together in a bowl along with the capers, nuts and sultanas. You can substitute celery for fennel if desired. Whisk together (with a fork) all dressing ingredients, loosen a little with a tbsp of cold water. Pour over salad and mix well before serving



Feta & Beetroot Salad (serves 10)

Ingredients:

Dressing:

200g bag of baby spinach leaves 500g of cooked beetroot 2x200g packs of feta, crumbled Bunch of mint leaves, roughly chopped Bunch of spring onions, finely sliced 2 long red chillies, halved, deseeded and finely sliced

5tbsp of olive oil 5tbsp honey 5tbsp lemon juice 1 tbsp Dijon mustard

Scatter the spinach onto a platter. Slice the beetroot into wedges and arrange on top of the spinach. Scatter over the feta, mint, sprint onions and chillies.

To make the dressing, put the oil, honey, lemon juice and mustard in a glass jar with lid Season and shake well
