

## Gardening in October

Autumn brings the beginnings of a slower pace in the garden, as the leaves start changing colour and the last of the harvests are gathered. We are still however busying ourselves with preserving, storing the gardens bounty and collecting seeds. Things to plant this month



- Autumn garlic can be planted from now until Christmas.
- Onion sets or seedlings can be planted now.
- · Broad and field beans can be sown directly or sown into pots and planted out once large enough.
- If you managed to sow some seeds in late summer now is a good time to get them planted out if you haven't already. Many will benefit from a net or cloche to keep the birds, pests and frosts at bay.

The Parish Council has subsequently adopted a policy of scrutinising planning applications for their impact on the climate, environment and amenity (using a checklist provided by the Group) and has urged our MP to support the Climate and Ecology Bill. Additionally, the Council has adopted the Green Landscape Plan drawn up by the Group.

Additionally, following the Parish Council's declaration of a climate emergency in September 2019, the Group has been successful in encouraging it to adopt resolutions in support of climate related issues. So, the Parish Council supported South Shropshire Climate Action in calling on Shropshire Council to implement '15 Transport Asks'.

#### On Whinberry Hill

The Group has been active too in arranging applications for grant aid for the management of the Parish's nine acres of land on the Black Hill. In 2022 the Parish Council made a successful application to the AONB's Conservation Fund which helped pay for bracken spraying, the felling of invasive Sitka spruce and the artwork and design for an information board. Work should start in October on the felling of the band of spruce round the boundaries of the plot; these have been sold as standing timber. Meanwhile, the Group framed an application to Defra's 'Farming in Protected Landscapes' scheme, which the Parish Council submitted in early September. If successful, this will finance more work on bracken, tree felling and the promotion of the whinberry and heather plants which will have flourished right across the Black Hill prior to it being afforested 70 or so years ago. More on this next month.

- River Clun at Clunton Bridge at 10.30am on Tuesday 10 October.

There was an encouraging attendance of 25 at the Group's gettogether in Clunbury Village Hall on 19 September. This started with Simon Marlow explaining his involvement with Cuan Wildlife Rescue at Much Wenlock brought about by him being presented with an exhausted Red Kite. Following on from Simon's informative contribution, there was a presentation outlining the range of activities and actions organised and supported by the Climate and Environment Group since its inception on 31 October 2019. Activities have included litter picking (now twice a year), parish rambles (eight to date), balsam bashing (annually) and river water quality monitoring (monthly since September 2022). The financial support received from the Parish Council was acknowledged, including the purchase of litter grabbers and a contribution towards a water monitoring kit.

## Courgette and Lime Drizzle Cake

Thank you to Beth Parmar of Vegify Cookery School at Little Brampton <u>www.littlebramptonbarn.co.uk</u> for sharing this tasty recipe, perfect for this time of year.

A delicious and moist loaf cake which is ideal for using up any courgettes growing in the garden.



## Ingredients

200g light brown sugar
200ml sunflower or
vegetable oil
4 eggs
175g self-raising flour
½ tsp baking powder
75g ground almonds
150g grated courgettes
2 limes, zest and juice
6 tbsp granulated
sugar

Preheat oven to 165 C and grease and line a loaf tin.

Combine sugar, oil and eggs in a bowl.

Add the flour, baking powder and almonds and mix to combine.

Squeeze the excess liquid from the courgettes and add to the mixture along with the lime zest and half the juice.

Mix well.

Pour into the loaf tin and bake for 40-50 minutes until a skewer inserted into the centre of the cake comes out clean.

Allow to cool for a few minutes and then make holes all over

Allow to cool for a few minutes and then make holes all over the top of the cake.

Combine the remaining lime juice with the sugar and pour over the cake while it is still in the tin.

Allow to cool before turning out.
