

Climate and Environment Group Report On Whinberry Hill

Following success in gaining grant aid from Farming in Protected Landscapes, work is underway on a series of projects on the Parish Land on the Black Hill. These will run between now and March next year, with bracken spraying following on in August.

The first contract has now been completed, it was for tree felling,

logging and bracken raking and was undertaken by Carnog Working Horses over the four days 3-6 November. Despite some very inclement weather, Barbara Haddrill and her two horses, Bluebell and Molly, kept at it and did a lot of good work. (See picture opposite) Twenty-seven enthusiastic and hard-working volunteers turned out on 5 November. They felled large numbers of small Sitka Spruce and some bigger ones too, with mountains of brash being burned and the

It is anticipated that the harvesting of the fringe of larger Sitka Spruce will start soon. After that an excavator will be on site to do a range of tasks including some scraping of the surface layer of consolidated bracken litter.

Litter picking

Seven stalwarts turned out on 18 November meeting at the Hundred House from where we fanned out onto neighbouring roads, including Kempton's 'top road', gathering 12 bags altogether. We'll convene again at the end of the winter.

An Alternative Christmas Pudding from my mother's treasured recipe book

1 tbs almonds 4oz sugar

1 tbs glace cherries (chopped) 3 egg volks 1 tbs dried apricots(chopped) 1 pt milk

1 tbs glace pineapple or papaya(chopped) Vanilla essence

1 tbs crystallised ginger(chopped) ½ pt stiffly whipped

cream

1 tbs mixed peel

1 tbs angelica (if available) or green glace cherries (chopped)

3 tbs fruit liqueur e.g., Cointreau or Cherry

(for non-alcoholic version try Grenadine)

Method

Essentially, this is a festive ice cream that can be made without a machine.

Heat milk, add yolks and sugar, stir, and cook gently until thick and smooth. Cool and add vanilla essence to taste. Partially freeze, stir well, and add whipped cream, nuts and fruit and place back in the freezer.

Take a Christmas pudding shaped bowl and line with cling film.

When the mixture is nearly frozen stir well and add fruit liqueur, mix once more and then put mixture into the lined bowl and freeze until solid. Take out of freezer about 10-15 minutes before serving, unmould and decorate appropriate to the season!!

A few meringues made from the egg whites will complete this festive dessert very prettily.

December in the garden

With Christmas approaching fast the garden is often our last priority at this time of the year.

However our gardens or local walks can offer us decorations for Christmas. From foliage for wreaths, our tables, mantles or to decorate presents. Better for our pockets and the environment with the ability to be composted at the end. Although please ask permission to forage on private land, never remove a plant's roots and always leave plenty of each plant for wildlife.



To make your own garland or wreath you'll need to collect foliage such as evergreen (off cuts from the bottom of your Christmas tree work well) and variegated foliage, holly, rosehips, pine cones, gorse and teasels.

Make bunches of your mixed foliage, using wire or twine at the stems. When you have enough tie them together making a chain, keeping stems behind the next bunch, repeat the process until you have the desired length. To form a wreath use 5-6 bunches, tying it into a circle. Then add any embellishments or lights until you're happy with your creation.



If you're lucky enough to have vegetables growing for your Christmas Dinner don't forget to harvest them in enough time, before a frost. Parsnips especially are rather difficult to harvest from frozen ground!
